## **Remembering George!**

### **1953 Studebaker Coupe**

There was time when I had 3 of these at once. Sadly, those days are gone.

A not too bright acquaintance of mine had a car to envy: a royal blue metallic '53 Stude coupe with black pleated naugahyde interior, black walls and baby moon hubcaps with a 1956 Olds and 4 speed hydro to pull it around town. His name was Edwin White (no relation to Gemini IV Astronaut). He had a bad habit of trying to wear out the right rear tire on the Stude. After a couple of tickets, his Dad, also Edwin White threatened to sell the car if he got one more ticket. Well, he tried on Glen Gray's 1956 Ford in full view of the local police one night. He thought that would be it. Well, the older Edwin White removed the car from service and told junior that he could drive it again when the ol' man said he could.

Now, Junior had an extra key, and was not above taking the car out for a spin when Edwin Sr. worked nights. Jr. was pretty careful, however to keep a low profile where the law was concerned.

One evening though, he could not resist the temptation to show someone how far he could extend the "one-tire-fire". About half way through the smoky burnout, the Stude stopped dead in its tracks. It refused to re-start. It only made a funny grunting noise and an occasional backfire. Ed thought, "well, at least the cops did not get me". He and a buddy towed the car home, stashed in the garage, intending to do surgery when the 'ol man was not around. He had not reckoned at the prying eyes of "old Mrs. Wagner" mentioned to Ed Jr's mom that she had seen the lads towing the car home the previous night. This is about 4:30 the same day. I knew that Ed Sr. had left for work about 4 and just could not resist driving over and leaving about a 50 ft. Strip of right rear tine burnout in front of the house. 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## CRUZIN CUISINE

### Lemony Zucchini Bread

4 cups all purpose flour

1 ½ cups sugar

1 package (3.4 oz) instant lemon pudding

1 ½ tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. salt

4 eggs

1 ¼ cup of milk

1 cup vegetable oil

3 tbsp. Lemon juice

1 tsp. lemon extract

2 cups shredded zucchini

¼ cup poppy seeds

2 tsp. Grated lemon peel

In a large bowl, combine the flour, sugar, pudding mix, baking soda, baking powder and salt. With another bowl, whisk the eggs, milk, oil lemon juice and extract. Stir into dry ingredients just until moistened. Fold in the zucchini poppy seeds and lemon peel. Pour into two greased 9-in. x 5-in. x 3-in. loaf pans. Bake at 350 for 50-55 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pans onto wire racks to cool completely. Yield 2 loaves.
